RITE of Spring

Kate Anderson gave an update for the Rite of Spring planning, and shared the communications plan, the volunteers that will be in attendance, informed the commission that Washington County recycling will be in the green lot from 8:00-2:00, and discussed the free give-away items.

Sustainability Plan

Bob Goebel provided the commission an update on all of its vehicles and equipment which are gasoline or diesel based. The commission discussed with Bob the opportunities we may have with some of the equipment, to potentially replace some of them with an electric version when it is time to replace them. Bob mentioned that when he has discussions with the city about replacement vehicles in June, that he would include the Environmental Commission for input as well. Discussions included 3.4 Travel Goal 1: When City vehicles are replaced, default to electric vehicles or plug-in hybrid as models are available, and also included 3.2 Energy Goal 5: Replace 10% of City-owned gasoline powered equipment with electric equipment by 2026.
